

Gnome-Shell Extensions

Via Debian Packages

Installing the Shell-extension package from the debian repository. This installs some Gnome Extensions which are sanctioned by Debian


```
apt-get install gnome-shell-extensions
```

Activate shell extensions using the Gnome Tweak Tool, which is available in the Applications menu as "Advanced Settings". If you don't have it installed, you can do so with

```
apt-get install gnome-tweak-tool
```

Manually from the Gnome Project Website:

You may browse extensions at <https://extensions.gnome.org/>. On the extension's description page there is a button which installs the extension automatically:
